- The Anti-Corruption Directorate with the Prosecutor General of the Republic of Azerbaijan was established in 2004 based on the Article 36 of the United Nations Convention against Corruption and the key activities of the Directorate include:
- examination and investigation of the information received on corruption offenses;
- conducting preliminary investigation of corruption crimes;
- carrying out search operations with the aim of preventing, detecting and disclosing corruption crimes
- international cooperation; participate on behalf of state at UNCAC, OECD and GRECO's assessment mechanisms

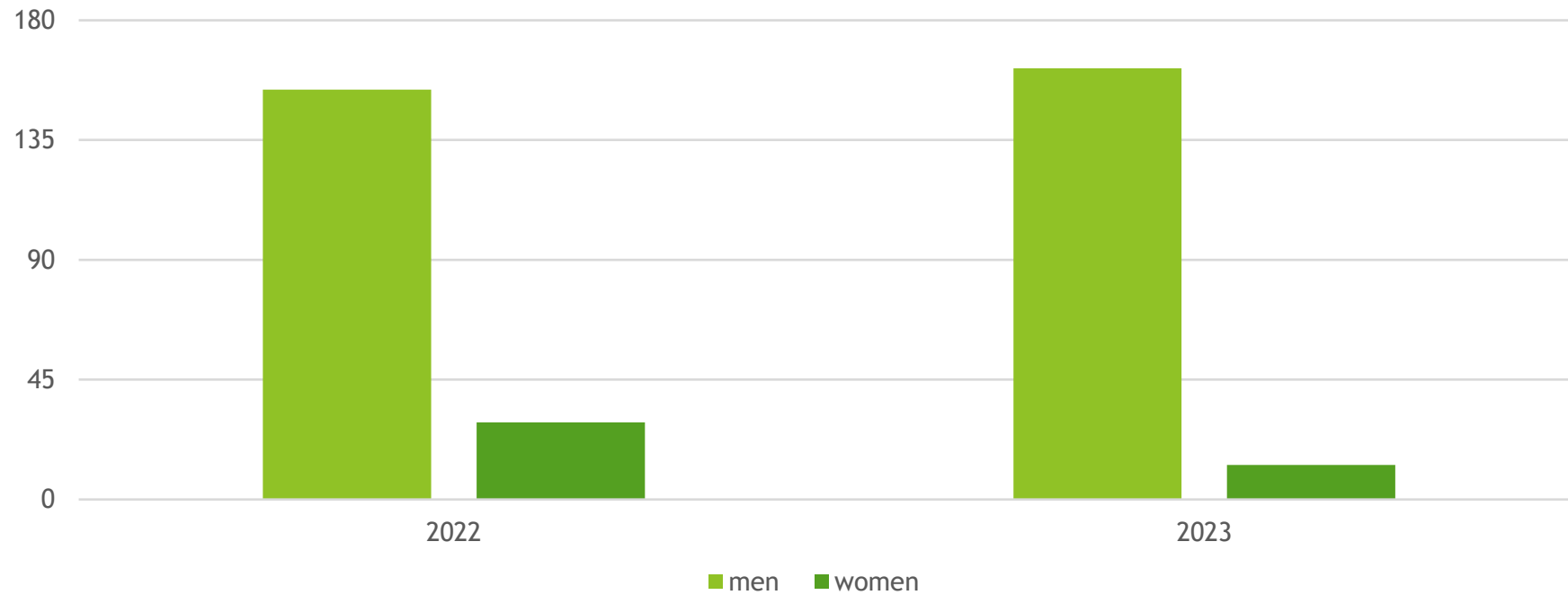
- Youth engagement Programs
