

Information note on the substantive agenda items considered by the Open-ended Intergovernmental Working Group on the Prevention of Corruption of the Conference of the States Parties to UNCAC from its first to fourteenth sessions
(Date of status: 28 August 2024)

The present note is a compilation of the substantive agenda items considered by the Working Group on the Prevention of Corruption from its first session held in December 2010 to its fifteenth session. It was prepared by the secretariat of the Conference of the States Parties to UNCAC to inform the consideration of the provisional agenda item 3 entitled “Future priorities in the prevention of corruption” by the Working Group on the Prevention of Corruption at its fifteenth session held on 3-6 September 2024.
