	iTeen Leadership Programme for Senior Secondary School Students ICAC recruits senior secondary students as iTeen Leaders and provides them with leadership training to enhance their understanding on the work of ICAC and awareness of the evils of corruption, as well as reinforce their positive values. The student leaders assist their teachers in organising probity promotion activities and disseminating integrity messages to their fellow schoolmates. The programme also supports the Senior Secondary Curriculum in enriching students' whole-person

	students as "i Junior Leaders" to carry out online and offline activities
	with positive messages. Activity manual and tailor-made supporting materials under different moral education themes are provided to participating schools to facilitate the programme implementation. Training workshops are also organised for the student leaders to enhance their teamwork and communication skills. To strengthen support to primary schools for developing school-based values education curriculum, theme-based moral education resources are produced for teachers' use.
Lessons learned in implementing the initiative	Youth engagement programmes are effective means to promote integrity and anti-corruption messages to students at different levels of education. Through versatile participatory activities, youth leaders are capable of providing strong support and creative ideas in promoting probity messages and positive values to their fellow students.
Challenges encountered in implementing the initiative	Youth engagement programmes for diversified targets (primary, secondary and tertiary students) require considerable financial and manpower resources. The ICAC Ambassador Programme, in particular, involves ICAC staff to serve as mentors of the "ICAC Ambassadors" to provide them with personal guidance and advice throughout the project. Sustainability of the programme is subject to availability of manpower resources.
