Detailed description of initiative	Some offenders, nowadays, misuse legal persons, legal arrangements, or Trusts as means to conceal, hide or maintain secrecy their true ownership of money and assets related to the abuse of business sectors for money laundering and terrorism financing. As a founding member of Asia Pacific Group on Money Laundering (APG), Thailand is strengthening its measures for transparency of and beneficial ownership of legal persons and legal arrangements in compliance with the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) 40 recommendations. Likewise, under framework of Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), member states are to exchange BO information with a view to preventing tax evasion and enhancing collection of taxes. However, the absence of BO information law, which determines duties of legal persons, legal arrangements and trusts operating their activities in Thailand to report their BO information to authority causes inefficiency and difficulty for the public sector to prevent, inspect and prosecute offenders. The draft BO information bill shall allow provision of BO information to requesting domestic and foreign agencies in accordance with laws or agreement; thereby ensuring transparency of such bodies' activities. Moreover, the law is set to enhance the supervision of the public sector and the enforcement of relevant laws.
