<b>Title of initiative</b>	The Making of Visits to Strengthen Anti-Corruption Cooperation with Entities in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area

<b>Short summary of initiative</b> (please indicate the start date/duration if relevant)	Since the pandemic situations of Mainland China and the Macao SAR were relatively stable at that time, a CCAC Delegation led by Commissioner Chan Tsz King visited nine cities in the Greater Bay Area of the Guangdong Province in January and February 2021, with an aim to deepen mutual ties, reinforce cooperation and promote privileged exchange channels to facilitate mutual anti-corruption work.
<b>Detailed description of initiative</b>	In January and February 2021, the CCAC Delegation led by Commissioner Chan Tsz King visited nine cities in the Greater Bay Area of the Guangdong Province to deepen mutual ties and cooperation and promote exchanges with the Commissions for Discipline Inspections in the region.  In late January, the CCAC Delegation visited Guangzhou, Foshan, Zhaoqing and Zhuhai, and in late February, Shenzhen, Zhongshan, Jiangmen, Dongguan and Huizhou. Together with representatives of the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection and the Provincial Commission for Discipline Inspection of Guangdong, visits to the Provincial Commission for Discipline Inspection of Guangdong and the Commissions for Discipline Inspection of the aforementioned cities were paid.  In a meeting with the Deputy Director of the Provincial Commission for Discipline Inspection of Guangdong, the CCAC Commissioner highlighted that Guangdong, the Hong Kong SAR

	<p>and the Macao SAR had held a joint meeting in 2019 and had drafted a preliminary memorandum of understanding on anti-corruption cooperation between the National Supervision Commission and the Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macao.</p> <p>The CCAC Commissioner suggested that Macao should sign a memorandum of anti-corruption cooperation with Mainland China in order to build a solid legal foundation in line with the construction of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area.</p> <p>At that time, the Deputy Director of the Provincial Commission for Discipline Inspection of Guangdong expressed his intention to deepen the cooperation with the Macao SAR CCAC in judicial investigations and improve the work performances of both parties through exchanges and training of middle and high-level personnel.</p> <p>The Delegation also visited a number of integrity education bases and private enterprises to understand the integrity education activities carried out in Mainland China and the anti-corruption management of non-public enterprises.</p> <p>The CCAC has a plan for local university and secondary school students to visit the anti-corruption and clean government education bases in neighbouring cities of the Greater Bay Area and enrol in integrity education programmes in the future. In addition, the CCAC also hopes to assist local enterprises that intend to expand their businesses in the Greater Bay Area by strengthening their integrity management tools.</p>
